Whenever the nerve of a tooth is disturbed by corrosion or infection, a root canal might be required. In the course of a root canal treatment, the pulp or nerve center of the tooth, decay, bacteria and nerves are removed. The resulting space is then filled with special, medicated, dental materials, to enable the teeth to fully recover.

When a tooth dies and needs to be removed, oral health care professionals typically advise individuals to opt for a root canal. Removing a tooth may end up costing more and could initiate other problems with the neighbouring teeth. Root canal treatments are tremendously successful and usually last forever. Nevertheless occasionally, a tooth might require to be re-checked due to new bacterial infections.

A few of the signs or symptoms that might call for a root canal procedure consist of an abscess on the gums, heightened sensitivities to cold and hot stimulus, a severe toothache, and swelling and soreness all-around the tooth.

On rare occasions, you may not sense any tenderness or have any warning signs. Other issues that might create a need for a root canal treatment consist of an infection or an abscess within the tooth, a corroded root pulp, or injury or trauma to the tooth.
